**I. Take Time To
Communicate**

A. Parents Are To Raise Their Children

- **Two methods must be used: Example**
 - **Young children get “concrete examples” better than abstract principles**
 - **Where better to let your light shine for Jesus than before your children *Matt.5:16***
 - **Do parents lecture their children on being faithful then show unfaithfulness?**
 - **“Wow! They really believe this stuff.”**

A. Parents Are To Raise Their Children

- **Two methods must be used: Verbal**
- **It takes time to teach verbally *Deut.6:7***

7 “You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up” *Deut.6*

- **The worse kind of debt isn't the national debt but the spiritual debt! *Jud.2:7, 10***

B. Communication Gap In Many Families

- **Can we really talk with our children to find a good conclusion? *Jas.1:19-20***
 - **Before parents blame everyone else maybe they should look to themselves!**
 - **Sometimes it's better to see a child angry than to see him discouraged *Col.3:21***
 - **Jesus' Golden Rule applies to children like it does to everyone else *Matt.7:12***



**II. Spend Time To
Recreate**

A. “Come Aside And Rest”

- Jesus knew there are times when people need to recharge their battery *Mk.6:31-32*

“**Rejoice, O young man, in your youth,** And let your heart cheer you in the days of your youth; Walk in the ways of your heart, And in the sight of your eyes” *Ecc.11:9a*

- Young people, God wants you to have good, clean fun *Prov.17:22*

“But know that for all these God will bring you into judgment” *Ecc.11:9b*

- Convince them you have time for them!

III. Use Time To Discipline



A. Fail To Spend Time Disciplining

- God will call into judgment those who had the primary duty of child rearing / *Sam.3:13*

- Often punishment for failing to train our children hurts us in this life *Prov.29:15*

15 The rod and rebuke give wisdom, But a child left to himself brings shame to his mother

- Are parents today using discipline as part of their child training? *Heb.12:11*

A. Fail To Spend Time Disciplining

B. Remember The Purpose of Discipline

- **Parents are to raise their children in the training and admonition of the Lord *Eph.6:4***
 - **“If we discipline our children they will not believe that we love them” / *Sam.2:22-29***
 - **Balance, consistency, and fairness builds a fine Godly person *Prov.22:6***
 - **This is God’s way of parenting!**
